Picture this: the music of Mozart, Beethoven, Mendelssohn, Brahms and Tchaikovsky; the wines of Clos Pegase, Frog's Leap, Provenance, Silverado, Mondavi, Merryvale, Beringer and Hess along with the views of Napa Valley. All of this is waiting for you at Music in the Vineyards 18th festival of chamber music.

Every summer, for three glorious weeks in August, musicians from all over the globe come to the Napa Valley to rehearse, rethink and perform the great works of chamber music as well as the little known gems. Audiences are introduced to every piece by the saucy and informative commentary of concert host Michael Adams. You'll never know when the next salacious detail of a composer's life will be revealed or an interesting political context of a piece is brought to life.

This summer we celebrate a few "firsts": like a woodwind quintet concert featuring five all-stars from around the country. Hear the world premiere of a new string quartet by composer Daniel Brewbaker performed by the renowned Borromeo Quartet at Clos Pegase. And festival debuts by violinist Florin Parvulescu (San Francisco Symphony), violists Jonathan Vinocour and Thomas Turner (Principal Violists of San Franciso Symphony and Minnesota Orchestra, respectively) and flutist, Jasmine Choi (Principal, Cincinnati Symphony).

Some of your favorite artists return again this summer: pianists Wei-Yi Yang, William Wolfram, Jeffrey Sykes and Eric Zivian; violinists Axel Strauss, Dale Barltrop, Erin Keefe, Guillermo Figueroa and Ara Gregorian and cellists Tanya Tomkins and Joshua Roman; plus the renowned Pacifica Quartet.

As always, every Thursday there is an Open Rehearsal from 2-4:30, free for all. We are also happy to again present The Rhythm Sisters in their thoroughly entertaining Family Concert, for the 4-12 year old classical music lover!

Plan to join us this summer at one of our 17 concerts where you can sip a glass of Napa Valley's finest while basking in the sounds of the greatest music ever written.
