

# Festival Artist Biographies

### Daria Adams, violin

ADOPTED BY ROSEMARY & GARY RICHARDSON Violinist Daria Adams, the founding Artistic Director of *Music in the Vineyards* along with her husband Michael, is a member of the world-renowned Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra where she has been featured in solo and chamber music performances. Since joining the SPCO in 1987, she has traveled the world in tours to Asia, Europe and across North America. An ardent Baroque music performer, Daria is a founding member of the Blue Baroque Band, made up of colleagues from the SPCO. The BBB was a featured ensemble-in-residence at MITV in 2006 and 2009.

Daria has been a guest at music festivals in Newport, Rhode Island; Banff, Canada; the Cactus Pear Festival in Texas; the Bach Dancing and Dynamite Society; the Festival de Musica Rondena and in Lyon, France and Vaasa, Finland.

Daria spent four years playing in the Santa Fe Opera Orchestra, where she also took an interest in a musician sitting in the back of the pit, one Michael Adams. It soon became an interesting summer. She now lives in Minneapolis with her husband, three children (17, 15 and 13), a dog and a cat.

#### Michael Adams, viola

ADOPTED BY BART BERG

Violist Michael Adams has carved out a unique career that has lead down many roads: as a chamber musician, an orchestral player, writer on music, radio commentator and producer, host of the Minnesota Orchestra's Adventures in Music family concerts and, along with his wife Daria, the founding Artistic Director of *Music in the Vineyards* Festival in 1995. As MITV's concert commentator and emcee, his goal is to make the music sound so interesting — with stories, explanations and analysis — that people can't wait to hear

it. (This is usually accomplished by plagiarizing the work of others.)

Michael joined the Minnesota Orchestra in 1988 at the invitation of conductor Edo de Waart after a successful stint as a music producer and host for classical WCAL-FM in Minneapolis/St. Paul and later, for Minnesota Public Radio. Michael attended both The Fastman School of Music and The Mannes College of Music in NYC, escaping largely unscathed by the discipline of academia. He has been a member of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, the Denver Chamber Orchestra, the Colorado Springs Symphony, the Oklahoma Symphony Orchestra and, most importantly, the Santa Fe Opera Orchestra, where he met his future wife Daria Tedeschi down in the deep, dark orchestra pit. (True story!) Michael is an avid bicyclist, enjoys canoe camping in Minnesota's Boundary Waters Wilderness Area, sailing with friends on Lake Superior and planning fantasy vacation trips with his collection of maps.

Axel frequently performs at various music festivals in the US and abroad, taking him to Germany, India, Korea and Japan. At the age of seventeen he won the silver medal at the Enescu Competition in Romania and has been recognized with many other awards, including top prizes in the Bach, Wieniawski and Kocian competitions. He maintains a busy performance schedule and serves as Professor of Violin at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. Axel performs on an outstanding violin by J.F. He maintains a vital interest in new music with recent premieres of works by Chen Yi, Augusta Read Thomas, Kevin Puts, Ned Rorem, Jennifer Higdon, Sebastian Currier, Paguito D'Rivera and Lowell Liebermann. Phillip also pursues creative projects across musical styles with other artists, including Billy Childs, Mike Seeger and Tod Machover. He has performed at the Marlboro, Tanglewood, Norfolk, Aspen, Bowdoin and Skaneateles music festivals. Phillip is an Assistant Professor of Viola and an Associate Professor of Chamber Music at the Eastman School of Music. He is the past president of Chamber Music America.

#### Eric Zivian, piano

Eric Zivian was born in Michigan and grew up in Toronto, Canada, where he attended the Royal Conservatory of Music. After receiving a diploma there, he attended the Curtis Institute of Music and went on to receive graduate degrees from Juilliard and Yale. Eric has given solo recitals in Toronto, New York, Philadelphia and the San Francisco Bay Area. He has performed Mozart and Beethoven concertos with the Toronto Symphony

Orchestra and the Beethoven Triple Concerto with the Santa Rosa Symphony. Since 2000, Mr. Zivian has performed extensively on original instruments. He is a member of the Zivian-Tomkins Duo, a fortepiano-cello duo and he is also a member of the Left Coast Chamber Ensemble and has performed with the Empyrean Ensemble and Earplay. In addition to her appearances with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, Ms. Zori has been a guest at chamber music festivals including the Chamber Music at the "Y" series in New York City, the Festival Casals in Puerto Rico, Chamber Music Northwest and the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, Ms. Zori is now the artistic director of the Brooklyn Chamber Music Society, which she founded in 2002.


